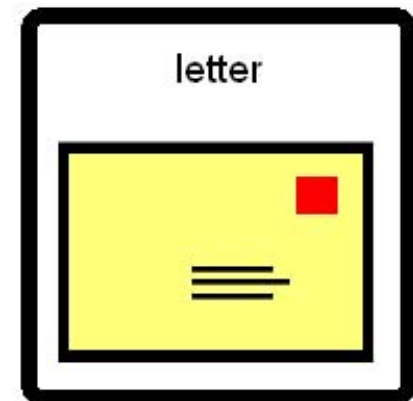

A postal worker is a person who works in our neighborhood.



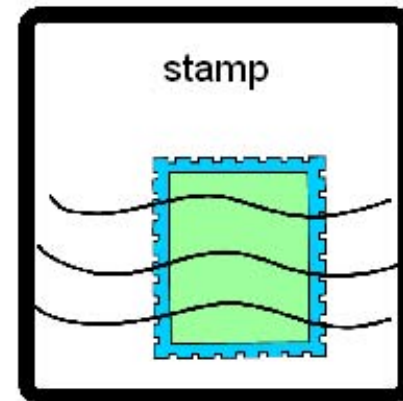
Postal workers bring us
letters and packages.



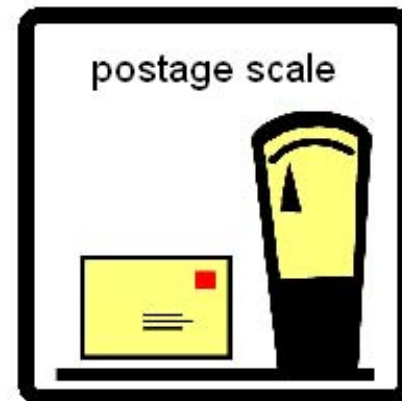
How does a postal worker know where to deliver the letters and packages ?



Each letter or package has the name, address, and zip code of the person it is being sent to.



The letters also need stamps. The stamps tell the post office that the postage is paid.



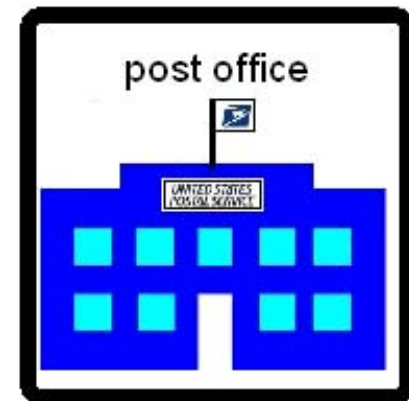
Postage is how much a person pays to mail a letter or package. Packages need to be weighed on a postage scale to find out how much postage is needed.



When you put a letter in the mailbox, it is collected and taken to a post office to be sorted.



Postal workers drive special mail trucks. They use the trucks to collect and deliver the mail.



The postal workers deliver the mail to the local post office.



At the post office, workers use the name, address and zip code to find where each letter goes. They sort the letters into cubbies.



This is the main post office building in New York City. It has its own zip code, an emergency window open 24 hours daily and 2,500 employees!



Engraved outside the building is the pledge,
"Neither snow, nor rain, nor heat, nor gloom
of night stays these couriers from the swift
completion of their appointed rounds."

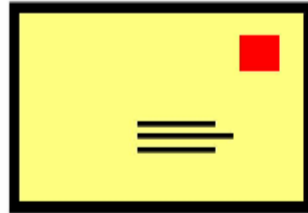


Whether you live in a city, in the country, or on a farm, postal workers will get your mail to you.

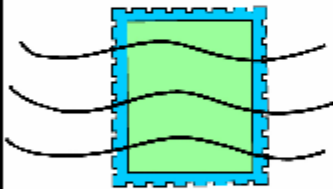

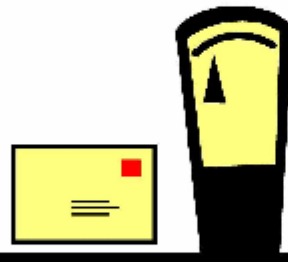
