

Lesson Plans for Winter

Lesson #1

Objective: To talk about the changes that happen in winter.

Materials: Winter book, large paper, markers.

Procedure: Have each student talk about something that happens in their home when winter starts. It may be new clothes, school supplies, or different items that are taken out. Make a list of winter items and winter customs.

Follow up: Have students write a sentence of what is special about the winter. Make a book of student's winter ideas. You can also have students draw a picture of what winter item is important to them and include it in the book.

Lesson #2

Objective: Learning about weather changes in winter.

Materials: Weather chart, thermometer, bar graph.

Procedure: For two weeks, record the weather and the temperature. See if the weather has had any changes. What kind of weather was the most? Did the weather get cooler or warmer? Discuss it with your class.

Follow up: Repeat this activity, and compare the chart with the first two weeks. Did the students understand what temperature is? Have them explain it to each other.

Lesson #3

Word web.

Materials: Book, scissors, crayons & glue, office circulars (winter pictures, etc...)

Objectives: Reading, sorting, and creativity

Procedure: Use the pages in the winter book to make a word web.

Follow up: Find pictures of items from an office magazine that you find in winter. Cut and add them to your word web.
